The Texas Voices, one of North Texas' premiere professional chamber choruses, will continue its seventh season of public concerts with *Latin Love: Poetry and Song from Latin America* on Sunday, Feb. 21 at Resurrection Lutheran Church in Plano. Classical guitarist Robert Harding will be guest soloist.

The 24-member chorus, directed by Alan Dyer, will perform its third concert of the season on Sunday, Feb. 21 at 6:30 p.m. at Resurrection Lutheran Church, 1919 Independence Parkway in Plano. Alan Dyer has been a choral director, performer, and educator in the Dallas/Fort Worth area for more than 20 years. In addition to directing The Texas Voices, Dyer is a member of the music faculty at Texas Woman's University, is a music associate at First Unitarian Church of Dallas, and the principal accompanist of the Children's Chorus of Greater Dallas. Dyer earned a master of music degree from Southern Methodist University and bachelor of arts degree in piano performance from Dallas Baptist University. He also has completed doctoral courses at the University of North Texas. Dyer is active in the American and Texas Choral Directors Associations.
